
THANK YOU FROM US ALL

Some children got up very early this week and ran a mile with Gary McKee before the start of the school day.



KS2 have been practicing their grid reference skills this week.

They have used OS maps of West Cumbria to write down the grid reference of different places including lakes, towns and villages. They discovered how 6 figure grid references are more precise than 4 figure ones.













KS2 enjoyed a science session with real scientists this week. The children are currently studying solids, liquids and gases and the experiment they conducted really brought to life the differences between the 3 states of matter and what chemical changes are reversible and irreversible.
