Our Year 6 pupils are working on their extended writing and all lessons are focused and pupils are working incredibly hard.

I received a lovely email this week from a member of the public recognising some of our pupils for their positive attitude to life outside of school and for being fantastic members of the community and helping to collect litter and taking care of our local area. We really do have amazing children.

I would like to take this opportunity to remind you of our uniform expectations, these are shared on our website - .School Uniform - Thornhill Primary School - West Lakes Multi Academy Trust

Please be aware that all children, boys and girls, are required to tie hair up when it is long enough to do so. This is for both health and safety reasons and to look smart and ready for school.

Children should not have patterns cut into the hair, or their hair dyed either wholly or partly and our policy states that the minimum use of guard 2 (6mm) and children should not have tram lines or designs in their hair. On health and safety grounds we do not allow children to wear jewellery in our school. The exceptions to this rule are earring studs in pierced ears, but children must be able to remove earrings by themselves. The wearing of any form of make-up is prohibited, this includes nail varnish. Any children wearing make-up will be asked to remove it immediately. This also applies to temporary tattoos. If you have any questions in relation to this please do not hesitate to ask.

1. Welcome and Introductions

3. Vision

SM shared her vision for the school and aims for development regarding teaching and learning and assessment.

In addition to discussions regarding assessment, the focus linked to further improving the school and provision for our pupils. The drive is for the school to be the very best it can be. Cumbria Healthy Start scheme



Eligible families in Cumbria are being encouraged to apply for free vitamins and help with the cost of food and milk as part of the Healthy Start scheme.

The Healthy Start scheme has two elements to it:

Support with the cost of food

The first element is a prepaid card worth up to £8.50 per week to spend on fresh produce such as cow's milk, fresh, frozen, or tinned fruit and vegetables, infant formula milk and fresh, dried, and tinned pulses.

To be eligible for the Healthy Start prepaid card, you must be more than 10 weeks pregnant or have parental responsibility for at least one child under four years old, and be in receipt of one of the following benefits:

- Child Tax Credit (but only if your family's annual income is £16,190 or less)
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Pension Credit
- Universal Credit (but only if your family earns £408 or less per month from employment)

You're also eligible for the Healthy Start scheme if you're pregnant and under 18, even if you do not receive any benefits.

Free vitamins

The second element offers free vitamins to pregnant women and mothers for up to six months after birth (if breastfeeding or dual feeding) as well as vitamin drops for children up until the age of four. Vitamins for pregnant women will initially be distributed by Midwives and Health Visitors during their early visits.

All families in Cumbria with children under the age of two will be able to collect 8 weeks' supply of children's vitamin drops from many community venues (see list of available community venues below) across the county- and it can be a different venue each time you need to pick up a new supply. Families with children aged between 2-4 years will be able to collect theirs from the same community venues using their Healthy Start pre-paid card.
